

It's rare. It's expensive. And there's a mystique about it. But Screaming Eagle Cabernet Sauvignon is no pretender. It's the real thing, and it deserves to be considered among Napa Valley's prestige wines...

You can't make wine this magnificent without fabulous grapes, and Screaming Eagle clearly comes from a spectacular vineyard...on the east side of Oakville, near the Oakville Crossroad...While ripening Cabernet (and smaller amounts of Merlot and Cabernet Franc) is routinely easy in this area, one of the trademarks of Oakville Cabernet is that the wines often display an herbal quality that manifests itself in a variety of subtleties, including hints of anise, sage, dusty berry, cedar and occasionally a whiff of new leather and tar. You find these shades of herb in Cabernets like Heitz Martha's Vineyard (grown on the west side of Oakville), with its signature minty currant personality, or Groth, which is one of the cooler sites on the valley floor. Screaming Eagle captures the best of all these elements. It also epitomizes exquisite balance, managing both to be enormously complex and concentrated, yet elegantly styled, with a smooth, polished texture.

CHÂTEAU D'YQUEM

Few wineries enjoy the same long-standing and hallowed reputation as Château d'Yquem, which has been considered something special since the middle ages. The vineyard has been producing late-harvest wine since at least the late 1500s, and in 1855 that history of winemaking showed. In 1855 the Gironde Chamber of Commerce, at the behest of French Emperor Napoleon III, had the Wine Brokers' Union develop a classification of all the best wine producers of Bordeaux. One of the classifications devised was for the sweet wines of Sauternes and Barsac. The best producers either fell into the "First Growth" or "Second Growth" category but Château d'Yquem ranked so highly that it was put at the top of the chart in its own category: "Premier Cru Supérieur."

So what puts this producer in a class of its own? Well, the vineyard is located in Bordeaux within the Sauternes district, which sits just to the west of the town of Langon. The 290 acres of Semillon (~75%) and Sauvignon Blanc (~25%) vines are perched upon the highest hill in the area, which provides the perfect site for production of the Château's famous dessert wine. The warm, dry topsoil littered with pebbles and gravel sits atop rich clay subsoils, which retain water for the vines. The elevation provides excellent natural drainage in conjunction with the coarse topsoil, to eliminate excess moisture, since the development of botrytis requires just the right of amount of moisture.

For those who may not know, botyris is short for the fungus strain Botrytis cinerea. The fungus is more commonly referred as "Noble Rot" in the winemaking world as it plays a key function in the development of sweet wines like those from the Sauternes region. The spores in this form develop in environments that alternate between moist and dry; too dry a climate - no fungus develops, but too moist a climate - the fungus develops into its destructive grey rot form. The fungus afflicts the grapes while they're still on the vine, feeding on the water within the grapes. The grapes in turn are desiccated and have their sugars and flavor compounds concentrated.

Once individual grapes exhibit the right level of botrytis affliction, they're handpicked by the harvesters and used for the wine. Naturally, the specific requirements of the grapes keep the yield low; to put that in perspective, each vine yields about one glass of wine, compared to what is normally five bottles! Furthermore, if there's a bad harvest, the grapes are anonymously sold off and no wine is made! Assuming all goes well though, the grapes are pressed multiple times and the juice put into new French oak barrels. However, each barrel only holds wine from a specific parcel of the vineyard, from a specific harvesting pass. The wine matures in the barrel for about three years, at which point the Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon are blended into the final product. While d'Yquem's winemaking process is lengthy (and particular), the resulting wine speaks for itself: a golden, honey-like nectar rich with stonefruit, nuttiness, flowers, vanilla and other oak spice aromas.

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

In the historic 1855 Bordeaux classification Château Lafite was listed as the #1 first growth! That auspicious title came from a history of quality winemaking with price tag to match; not much has changed. Much like its first growth contemporaries, Château Lafite Rothschild is historic, and has an extensive winemaking history. Its winemaking reputation began in the late 1680s with the Ségur family's expert cultivation in the vineyards. At that time, the Château was still named after its original owner Gombaud de Lafite; it wasn't until 1868 when the estate was sold to James Rothschild that its name changed to its current label of Lafite Rothschild. Since its purchase, the Château has remained in the hands of the Rothschild family. 2018 saw the anniversary of 150 years of Rothschild ownership of the estate. In 2019, the Baron and Sasha de Rothschild partnered with Zachys to auction off over \$7.8m of Lafite, Carruades, l'Evangile, Duhart-Milon and Rieussec from their respective estates. The oldest bottle in the offering was 1868 Lafite, and it realized a price of \$123,500 for 750ml. An imperial of 1959 realized \$160,550.

Château Lafite Rothschild consists of 277 acres planted in the northern edge of the Pauillac appellation with the traditional varietals of Bordeaux's red blends. Here, Cabernet Sauvignon takes center stage with 70% of the vineyard's plantings; Merlot plays a supporting role in the production, constituting another 25% of the plantings. The remaining vineland is split between Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. Despite the planting's percentage, Cabernet Sauvignon often makes up 80-95% of the final blend of their flagship grand vin (depending on the vintage). The vineyard also produces a label, Carruades de Lafite, which has more Merlot in the blend; usually that percentage is between 30% and 50%. Both wines are oaked for a bit under two years before bottling. The total production of the estate's grand vin ranges from year to year, but usually falls between 15,000 and 20,000 cases; the estate's second label is produced in comparable quantities.



THE GREATEST PRIVATE COLLECTION of CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

(LOTS 1036-1143)



Zachys & Lafite. The two names are now forever linked following our legendary sale of wines directly from the Château's cellars last year. Now, a year and a after that momentous sale, the greatest collection of Lafite in private hands is coming to auction. The story of this collection goes back decades. The consignor started collecting more than 40 years ago which is long before Zachys became an auction house. Indeed, he traveled to both London and Chicago at that point in time the only places holding wine auctions—to bid on his favorite wines. The wines he collected focused on Bordeaux's First Growths and most especially Lafite Rothschild, his favorite, which is known for its supreme elegance and refinement. He remembers fondly his annual trips to Chicago in February of each year where the wine auctions were poorly attended. At these auctions he was able to purchase his favorite wines at what would now be considered stunningly low prices. He would also buy frequently at the wine auctions held in London which was then the center of the wine auction world. Indeed, the 1806 Lafite in this offering was hand-carried back to the United States decades ago by none other than Fritz Hatton back when carrying a bottle of wine onto an airplane was allowed! Another reason that the consignor focused his collection on Lafite was that the cellar master himself, Monsieur Revelle, would come to the U.S. to re-cork the older bottles. He would open each bottle, smell the wine, and then proclaim it good or not. Those that didn't pass muster were literally poured down the sink's drain. Those bottles that did receive Monsieur's approval were recorked in the owner's presence. This guarantee from the Château ensured both the wine's integrity and its continued longevity. This is an astonishing vertical offering of Lafite Rothschild spanning over 200 years. Moreover, the condition of many of the bottles has been confirmed by the Château within the last 30 years. This offering indeed goes back farther than the offering that was done at Zachys directly from the cellars of Lafite in 2019. There is no other private cellar like this in the world, and this opportunity to add some of the rarest wines in the world to your cellar is likely to never be seen again.



All in all, bid with confidence as this collection is truly the "anchor" of this auction.

DOMAINE DE LA ROMANÉE-CONTI

Domaine de la Romanée-Conti produces what few would dispute are the world's most collectible wines.

Its pre-eminence is such that the cognoscenti refer to it simply as "The Domaine". If you're just getting into Burgundy, the reverence may seem a bit much, but a look at their vineyard holdings makes their supremacy a bit more understandable.

The jewel in the crown is the vineyard of Romanée-Conti itself. This site, initially called the Clos des Croux, was originally owned by the Benedictine monks of the abbey of Saint-Vivant de Vergy. The monks had received the vineyards from the Duchess of Burgundy Alix de Vergy in 1232. The property was sold by the monks in 1584 and renamed La Romanée in the 17th Century. The vineyard passed through several owners before being purchased by Louis-François de Bourbon in 1760. His status as the cousin of King Louis XV afforded him the title of Prince de Conti, giving rise to the current name of the vineyard.

After the Revolution, Romanée-Conti was sold to raise money for the fledgling Republic, and ended up in the hands of Jules Ouvrard, the son of Napoléon's banker. Upon his death, the heirs sold the vineyard to Jacques-Marie Duvault-Blochet, the ancestor of the de Villaine family, who still own the domaine, in partnership with the Leroy family. In 1911 Edmond Gaudin de Villaine purchased the winery which had originally belonged to the monks of the abbey. He moved the winemaking from Santenay, where Duvault-Blochet had been based, to Vosne-Romanée, near the vineyards, and gave the new winery its current name.

Duvault-Blochet amassed impressive vineyard holdings during his lifetime, including prime parcels in Romanée-Saint-Vivant, Richebourg, Echézeaux, and Grands-Echézeaux, as well as a plot called Les Gaudichots. Gaudichots adjoined a vineyard called La Tâche, which was owned by Count Liger-Belair. Domaine de la Romanée-Conti often sold Gaudichots under the name of La Tâche, much to the irritation of Liger-Belair, who unsuccessfully sued them.

At the death of the Comtesse Liger-Belair in 1931, La Tâche was sold to the Domaine, and the entire site of more than six hectares was then known as La Tâche. Romanée-Conti and La Tâche are both wholly-owned by Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, and are thus referred to in French as "monopoles". These are the two most desirable wines from DRC, although the Richebourg, Romanée-Saint-Vivant, Echézeaux, and Grands-Echézeaux are all made in the same way.

All of the vineyards are farmed according to biodynamic principals, and yields are kept very low. The hand-picked bunches are fermented whole in open-top wooden fermenters before being aged for approximately a year and a half in new casks. In addition to the parcels that they own, DRC leases (since 2009) just over two hectares of Corton from the heirs of the Prince de Mérode family.

What does all of this history mean for you, the collector? A bottle of DRC is a vinous experience like no other. At Zachys, we often get asked if the wine can justify its price tag. For collectors of DRC, or for those who have tasted it, the answer is almost always yes. For those for whom the wine is a bit more aspirational, a combination of the wine itself, and the history to which you are connected when you pop a cork, is a joint-experience rare in the wine world.

FOURRIER

Jean-Marie Fourrier took over the family property from his father in the mid-1990s and the quality of the Domaine's wines improved markedly and rapidly. Jean-Marie subscribes to the philosophy that great wines begin in the vineyard and he is fastidious about maintaining healthy, well-nurtured vines. He saw firsthand the importance of minimal intervention in the winemaking process (provided one had excellent raw materials from the vineyards), when he studied under the great Henri Jayer in the late 1980s. Fourrier is careful to crush only the choicest fruit, all completely destemmed, in his immaculately clean and recently outfitted with new stainless steel tanks fermentation room. He also limits the use of new oak to around 20% so as to better allow the Burgundian terroir to fully express itself in the glass. The product of all this hard work is wines marked by wonderful purity, transparency, and bright vibrant fruit, wines that are a true testament to the land that Jean-Marie Fourrier so carefully cultivates.

DOMAINE PONSOT

Domaine Ponsot in Morey St Denis has long been one of the most important domaines in the Côte d'Or. It began rather meagerly with just a hectare of vines in the 1920s (according to Remington Norman, though I have seen figures of an initial three hectares elsewhere), but had grown to the six hectares by the last 1940s, when Jean-Marie Ponsot began to work with his father, Hippolyte Ponsot. Jean-Marie succeeded to full control of the domaine in 1957, and his son, Laurent, (the current head of the family domaine) made his first vintage in 1983. Today the domaine is just short of nine hectares, with more than a third of it in Clos de la Roche, of which the Ponsots are the largest landholders. In addition to the family's own vines, the Ponsots had over the years entered into a number of different metayage (sharecropping) agreements, which brought vines under their control in crus such as Latricières- Chambertin, Griottes-Chambertin, Chambertin and Chambolle-Musigny Les Charmes, as well as a bit more Clos de la Roche and Clos St Denis to augment their own holdings.

For years the domaine's wines were reputed to be very inconsistent from vintage to vintage, with their successes amongst the very greatest wines of any given vintage, but the less successful vintages relative failures. Much of this has been attributed to the propensity of both Jean-Marie and Laurent Ponsot to harvest very late, shooting for maximum ripeness to add a powerful dimension to their wines. When this methodology worked, as in vintages such as 1980, 1985, 1989, 1990 or 1991, the Ponsot wines were monumental blockbusters, thick with lush, creamy old vine fruit, strongly marked by their respective terroirs and very complex. In the "homerun" vintages, Ponsot wines are rich, bordering on syrupy (as they have such voluptuous fruit), but with excellent structural elements and fine focuses as well.

ARMAND ROUSSEAU

I say, "Rousseau," you say, "Chambertin."

Few domaines are so closely identified with one appellation. As superb as Rousseau Chambertin is, however, it would be a mistake to overlook the rest of the range, since the wines of Domaine Armand Rousseau are lovely from the entry-level Gevrey-Chambertin straight through to the Chambertin and Clos de Bèze.

But let's start at the top. The first wine we should discuss is Gevrey-Chambertin Clos-Saint-Jacques.

Although it is Premier Cru and thus nominally lower in rank than several others in the portfolio, "CSJ" as it's sometimes known stateside, is a phenomenal site. Rousseau is the largest owner in this clos. The domaine's holdings consists of a magnificent swath of vines at the southern end of the vineyard that stretch from the tree line at the top of the hill down to the road. It is a superb holding and regularly produces wines that would outshine most grands crus. It receives aging worthy of a Grand Cru as well, spending 18 months in 70% new casks (whereas the Clos des Ruchottes sees 25% new casks during maturation). This is a wine capable of aging for 75 years or longer—something few Premier Crus can boast.

But the absolute pinnacle of the production at Rousseau are the Chambertin and Chambertin-Clos de Bèze. The two vineyards are contiguous, with Clos de Bèze lying just north of Chambertin (and south of Mazy-Chambertin). Some of the holdings in Chambertin date to 1920 and were among the first purchased by founder Armand Rousseau. Armand was born in 1884 and inherited some vineyards in 1902 when he turned eighteen. He worked in his youth as a wine broker, and married in 1909, accumulating a few more vines. At the time, the fruit was sold to négociants, as was common practice. After the First World War, Rousseau continued to accumulate vineyards. He purchased his first plot of Chambertin in 1920, and by 1921 had decided to bottle his wines at the domaine.

Clos de Bèze, however, did not make its appearance in the portfolio until 1961, under the management of his son, Charles Rousseau. Charles's son Eric has continued the expansion in both of these critical vineyards: he purchased more Clos de Bèze in 1992, and more Chambertin in 2009. The current holdings of 2.55 hectares in Chambertin make him the largest landowner, while their 1.42 hectares in Clos de Bèze are the second largest after Pierre Damoy. The two vineyards, located in such proximity, are very different. However, the winemaking is nearly identical: most of the fruit is destemmed; the extraction is very gentle, and the maturation is not exaggerated. It is only the Chambertin and Clos de Bèze that receive 100% aging in new oak casks.

To proceed with the rest of the wines in the order that they are tasted at the domaine, one would start with the Charmes-Chambertin. This wine is produced using fruit from Mazoyères-Chambertin (two-thirds of the blend), and from Charmes-Chambertin itself. In Burgundy, there is the possibility to label grapes from Mazoyères with the name of the Charmes vineyard just next door. Mazy-Chambertin is the next wine in the portfolio, produced from fruit from the northernmost vineyard in Gevrey-Chambertin. The Rousseau vines are in the Mazy-Bas section of this vineyard.

HENRI BONNEAU

Without question he is one of the world's great wine makers. He follows no path other than that set by his own intuition. Born in 1938 he comes from a long line of wine growers (twelve generations worth).

He started young and made his first wines in 1956 and the tender age of just eighteen. Since then he has gone on to become a guru in his field.

Very, very old vine Grenache is at the heart of his wines. They are made in a traditional way, perhaps unchanged from the nineteenth century. Now new barrels, in fact the youngest barrels will already be over a decade in age.

He bottles when he feels the wines are ready and releases them when he needs the funds. Nothing here is done in any sense or urgency, old school would be the understatement of the year.

The wines however are about as good as they come. Dense, earthy and incredibly concentrated, yet with time, they unfold into some of the greatest wines ever made. Indeed they are the stuff of legend.

Total holdings amount to roughly six hectares, split into a number of Cuvées. Henri changes what is released and made vintage to vintage depending what mother nature gives him. He is a true one off and his wine some of the greatest ever made, period.

SCARECROW

The heart and soul of the Scarecrow Cuvée dates back to the late nineteenth century. Born in 1895, J.J. Cohn rose from poverty in Harlem, New York to become the Chief of Production of MGM Studios in California. Cohn purchased a 180-acre estate in Rutherford in the Napa Valley as a retreat for his family. His estate bordered that of the legendary winemaker of Inglenook, Gustave Niebaum. In 1945, Niebaum convinced Cohn to plant eighty acres of Cabernet Sauvignon that he promised to purchase. This would become the base for the distinguished Inglenook Cabernet Sauvignons of the post-war era. It is important to note that these "Old Vines" that are now the hallmark of Scarecrow are still on their original rootstock planted in 1945, unlike most of the grafted rootstock found in Napa that was struck by phylloxera - possibly paying tribute to J.J. Cohn himself who lived to be 100 years old. Paying homage to his grandfather who during his time at MGM was instrumental in the making of film classics such as The Wizard of Oz, Bret Lopez honors J.J. Cohn with the wine that is Scarecrow.





The story behind these and the rest of the remarkable Marcassin wines began in the 1980s...At the time, Turley and Wetlaufer were two Burgundy lovers residing in Napa Valley who knew that they wanted to focus on Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. Early on, a friend suggested a long shot -- if you want to make great Pinot Noir, try the Sonoma Coast "We knew it was a wonderful site," says Wetlaufer, now fifty four, recalling the first time he and Turley (also fifty-four) laid eyes on what is now their Marcassin Vineyard. Appropriately enough, the vineyard's name means "young wild boar" in French...

In the end they decided to follow their hearts, and in 1986 they borrowed \$65,000 from Wetlaufer's mother to buy forty acres on a rugged ridge about ten miles north of the mouth of the Russian River. In 1987 they began to prepare the steep, rocky, southeast facing slope's soil for planting. In 1991 they planted the first of what today are fourteen acres of grapevines, with a 50-50 mix of Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. The vineyard sits at an altitude of 1,100 feet...

Turley has had striking across-the-board success with different wines from different vineyards. Her work ranges from the plush, enormously rich Bryant Family and Colgin Cabernets to the immense Turley Zinfandels to the elegant, concentrated Landmark Chardonnays. The fact that bottlings from each of these wineries are now considered among California's elite is testimony to her talents as a winemaker.

Her winemaking philosophy is simple but strict: Find great vineyards, farm them precisely, limit crops, make sure the grapes ripen fully (even if it leads to higher sugar levels than many winemakers prefer) and ferment using natural yeasts. "What you have," says Turley, "are grapes from different vineyards, all made the same way, by the same winemaker, using the same techniques, the same barrels. If they taste different, the taste is terroir."

Size is also essential to the Marcassin formula. "We knew we wanted to be small -- that allows us to have total control," she says. The perfect size, she says, is 100 barrels, enough for 2,500 cases. Eventually, the fourteen acres of Marcassin grapes will produce forty tons of grapes -- roughly 2,500 cases. For the time being, Marcassin's wines are made at the Martinelli winery in Russian River Valley. In the near future, Turley and Wetlaufer hope to add another five acres of vines, along with a winery...

Although the histories of Château Haut-Brion and La Mission are entwined, both have always been separate entities, sharing a common family name. It is only since 1983 that they have shared the same proprietor when it was taken over by the owners of Haut-Brion...

On November 2nd 1983, the present owners acquired La Mission after the owner Francis Dewavrin was unable to resolved internal family disputes over the way the property was managed and it marks a convergence of histories between Château Haut-Brion and La Mission, though only in the sense that they share the same owner: Clarence Dillon. He enlisted Jean-Bernard Delmas as Château-manager and there followed a period that has consolidated La Mission's position as one of the greatest estates, hovering just outside the First Growths.

Their commitment to innovation and improvements has been a catalyst for many estates in the Graves region to improve their wines, particularly with respect of clonal selection research. In 1987 the old chai was renovated, a new state-of-the-art cuvier was installed and a new bottling line was implemented in 1996. It must be emphasized that the estates are treated as separate entities, even though at some point the vines of both run side-by-side. In 2003 Jean-Bernard retired and handed the reins over to his son, Jean-Philippe Delmas.

The Wines

Certainly since the arrival of Jean-Bernard Delmas the style of wine has improved: the wine is more pure and the volatile acidity has been eradicated. At its best (the 1966, 1975, 1998) La Mission is a massive, tannic behemoth that has more in common with Château Latour than Château Haut-Brion. It is a powerful, sturdy wine with firm tannins and admirable longevity...

This is definitely one of the most intriguing wines in Bordeaux: the appeal of La Mission is that it seems to avoid the vagaries of wine-making trends and wears its heart on its sleeve. This is a classic wine in every sense of the word and it can make a seamless match with food. A poor La Mission is still a better wine than most; a good La Mission is a great wine and a great La Mission can be a religious experience. I have met few wine-critics who do not hold this estate in high esteem: it is a wine for true wine-lovers.

DOMAINE LEROY

How do you determine great? Is it size? Is it quality? Is it price? Is it 'reputation' (whatever that is)? Is it the amount of media coverage? However you do compute it, the greatest domaines of Burgundy today must be those under the control of Lalou Bize: the Domaine Leroy and her own Domaine d'Auvenay. The estates of Jadot, Faiveley and Bouchard Père et Fils are far larger, that of Romanée-Conti the most splendid in terms of the percentage of Grand Cru terroir, but for the nobility of its wines, pride of place must go to Leroy and to Domaine d'Auvenay. The sheer concentration, depth and intensity Lalou Bize manages to squeeze into her bottles is breathtaking. Lalou, born in Paris, was brought up in Meursault, in the mansion today occupied by her daughter Perrine. "From the word go I was fascinated," she says. "I was a cellar rat, watching and helping the cavistes rack the wines, taste them, bottle them. My mother kept calling me to come out of the cellar and play with my friends like a normal schoolgirl, but as soon as I could I crept back." In 1955 she persuaded her father to let her take over. She was twenty-three. "He gave me carte blanche," she says. "I started as I meant to go on. I bought finished wine, and only that which pleased me."

Lalou is now happy at the Domaine Leroy and on her own. "Look at my vines," she will say. "Look how healthy and comfortable they are." And, being Lalou, she will not fail to point out a neighbor's plot of excessively abundant, uncontrolled growth. "And come and taste the wine." Lalou's wines, according to her, are always 'extra'. The one-time cellar rat is now a master in her own right, and the wines she produces are triumphantly brilliant.

LE PIN

The vineyard has humble beginnings. Mme. Loubie owned the land from 1924 until her passing in March 1979 and during this time the wine was sold as generic Pomerol. When Jacques Thienpont purchased the meager 1.6-hectares parcel for one million francs, he named his wine Le Pin, after a solitary pine tree that shaded the property. His cousin, Alexandre Thienpont once told me that Jacques contemplated absorbing the tiny parcel into Vieux Château Certan in order to supplement the production, but had a change of heart once it was his possession, after all quality was already improving at Vieux Château Certan.

Throughout the 1980s and early 1990s the wine became an icon of modern Bordeaux. Le Pin was soon challenging the supremacy of Pétrus not only in terms of price, but in terms of quality. Its scarcity, memorable name, its understated label, charismatic proprietor and most importantly quality, provided the rocket fuel for its meteoric rise into the élite in a handful of years. The present encepagement is 92% Merlot with just 8% Cabernet Franc although the final blend is usually 100% Merlot, similar to Château Pétrus.

DOMAINE RAMONET

Pierre Ramonet was more than a character. He was, to use the old cliché – but it is true in this instance – a legend in his own lifetime. More or less from scratch, by dint of sheer hard work and a genius for wine, he built up one of the finest white wine domaines in Burgundy. Today the name of Ramonet is synonymous with top Chardonnay. The allocations for bottles are fought over, for every collector considers it his or her right to own some. They sell at auction for astronomical sums whenever they appear. On the rare occasions, as in January 1995 at the Montrachet restaurant in New York, when someone puts on a special vertical tasting and dinner, the tickets – and they are not cheap – are over-subscribed ten times. Ramonet in white is the equivalent of Henri Jayer or the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti in red.

Pierre Ramonet died in 1994 at the age of eighty-eight. He is much missed. But his echo lives on, and the wines, in the able hands of his grandsons Noel (born in 1962) and Jean-Claude (born in 1967) since the 1984 vintage (mais sous ses ordres, stoutly avers Noel), continue his reputation. They are very fine. A Ramonet wine is a Ramonet wine before it is a Chassagne, or a Bienvenues, or a Bâtard...or a Montrachet.

MACALLAN

Irish monk St Fillan was a Christian missionary who lived in the eighth century. During his travels through what is modern day Speyside in Craigellachie, Moray, he noted how fertile the land was. The Macallan, derived from Gaelic, is associated with prestige and quality and the reputation has lived on for well over 1000 years.

Exclusively using sherry casks in their older bottlings, their maturation and their style are known to be some of the most dense and rich whisky in Speyside and beyond.

The famed distillery has changed hands a few times over the centuries but the ultra-soft water source from deep underground remains constant. The demand for The Macallan malts far overshadows the supply and, as a result, any limited release by this distillery becomes an instant treasure.

Many purists of The Macallan maintain that the vintage bottles with distillation dating back from the 1970s contain some of the famous distilleries greatest drams. Today, Zachys has on offer some of these ultimately impossible to find bottles.

KENTUCKY

PAPPY VAN WINKLE

Forget apple pie. Few things can be described as distinctly American as Pappy Van Winkle. With immigrant roots in Holland by way of New York, Julian "Pappy" Van Winkle was a travelling salesman that eschewed his family's law business and would rise to own the wholesaler he began working for at age 18. Following Prohibition, which the distillery survived by producing medicinal Whiskey through a special Federal license, Pappy re-opened the Stitzel-Weller distillery and began producing premium Bourbon brands, such as Old Fitzgerald, Rebel Yell and Old Rip Van Winkle. Eventually Pappy's son Julian Van Winkle, Jr. took over the family business, working closely with his father until his death in 1965. Seven years later, shareholders coaxed Julian Jr. into selling off their stake in the distillery operations, yielding control of all brands except the one that bore the family name: Old Rip Van Winkle. Between 1972 and 1981, Old Rip Van Winkle was released, mostly in decorative decanters, using stock from the Stitzel-Weller distillery. In 1983, Julian Van Winkle III began bottling the brand at the Hoffman distillery in Lawrenceburg, purchasing the Whiskey from Stitzel- Weller until its closure in 1991. Today the Whiskey is made to the family's specifications through a special arrangement with the Buffalo Trace distillery under the direction of Julian Van Winkle III and his son, Preston. Bottled at various ages and proofs, the Van Winkle lineup has expanded to include the 10-year Old Rip Van Winkle, 12-year Van Winkle Family Reserve "Lot B," 15-, 20- and 23-year Pappy Van Winkle Family Reserve Bourbons and a 13-year Van Winkle Family Reserve Rye. The Bourbons are known as "wheated" Bourbons due to the inclusion of a healthy dose of wheat in the mashbill, adding a distinctive sweetness and smoothness which has helped the line garner accolades and the miniscule releases have led to an almost mythic status among Bourbon drinkers.
